# Welcome

The Sacrament of Communion is placed at the centre of church life at St Laurence Church.

In celebrating Holy Communion together we obey Jesus' command to 'do this in remembrance of me'. Those who are baptized in any Christian Church and whose practice is to receive Holy Communion are welcome to receive at this service. Alternatively, anyone is welcome to receive a blessing.

St Laurence Church has a toilet with baby-changing facilities. It is situated beyond the choir vestry; children **must always** be accompanied by an adult if they enter the vestry area. If you struggle with steps it may be easier to approach the toilet from the outside door – please ask a church warden for help.

### Introduction to the Season of Easter

The Great Fifty Days of Eastertide form a single festival period in which the Church celebrates the gloriously risen Christ:

The Paschal (Easter) Candle is lit for the first time on Easter Eve and is then lit at services until after the Feast of Pentecost. Alleluia appears frequently in liturgical speech and song; and white or gold vestments and decorations emphasize the joy and brightness of the season.

On the fortieth day there has from the late fourth century been a particular celebration of Christ's ascension. He commissions his disciples to continue his work, he promises the gift of the Holy Spirit, and then he is no longer among them in the flesh. The ascension is therefore closely connected with the theme of mission.

The arrival of the promised gift of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost (used to be called Whit) completes and crowns the Easter Festival. At the end of the service we may use this commission:

# **Commission on the Feast of Pentecost**

For fifty days we have celebrated the victory of our Lord Jesus Christ over the powers of sin and death. We have proclaimed God's mighty acts and we have prayed that the power that was at work when God raised Jesus from the dead might be at work in us.

As part of God's Church here in *Northfield*, I call upon you to live out what you proclaim.

Empowered by the Holy Spirit, will you dare to walk into God's future, trusting him to be your guide?

#### All By the Spirit's power, we will.

Will you dare to embrace each other and grow together in love?

#### All We will.

Will you dare to share your riches in common and minister to each other in need?

#### All We will.

Will you dare to pray for each other until your hearts beat with the longings of God?

### I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen Let us affirm our faith in Jesus Christ the Son of God.

Though he was divine, he did not cling to equality with God, but made himself nothing. Taking the form of a slave, he was born in human likeness. He humbled himself and was obedient to death, even the death of the cross. Therefore God has raised him on high, and given him the name above every name: that at the name of lesus every knee should bow, and every voice proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. We give you thanks and praise for the gospel we have received. Christ died for our sins. Alleluia. **He is risen indeed. Alleluia.** 



which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Jesus Christ is Lord: Lord, by your cross and resurrection you have set us free. You are the Saviour of the world. Praise to you, Lord Jesus: Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life, Lord Jesus, come in glory.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of Laurence and all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

All **Amen.** 


# The Breaking of the Bread

Most merciful Lord, your love compels us to come in. Our hands were unclean, our hearts were unprepared; we were not fit even to eat the crumbs from under your table. But you, Lord, are the God of our salvation, and share your bread with sinners. So cleanse and feed us with the precious body and blood of your Son, that he may live in us and we in him; and that we, with the whole company of Christ, may sit and eat in your kingdom. Amen.

# **Giving of Holy Communion**

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you.

Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

The president and people receive communion.

If you are baptized (christened) and want to grow closer to God you are welcome to receive Holy Communion.

Alternatively, everyone is welcome to receive an individual blessing.

We receive the bread into outstretched hands. If you would like to receive wine please do so by taking a sip from the chalice. This is now the ONLY way to receive wine

Gluten-free wafers are available. Please ask the person administering the bread.



To indicate that you would like to receive a blessing

This is a very holy time so please keep conversation to a minimum (though we appreciate this is not easy with tiny children.) Hymns may be sung please join in. The hymn numbers are on the board to the left of the eagle lectern.



# <u>Prayers for personal use during the administration of</u> <u>Holy Communion</u>

This is the table, not of the church, but of the Lord. It has been made ready for those who love Him and who want to love Him more.
