Welcome

The Sacrament of Communion is placed at the centre of church life at St Laurence Church.

In celebrating Holy Communion together we obey Jesus' command to 'do this in remembrance of me'. Those who are baptized in any Christian Church and whose practice is to receive Holy Communion are welcome to receive at this service. Alternatively, anyone is welcome to receive a blessing.

St Laurence Church has a toilet with baby-changing facilities. It is situated beyond the choir vestry; children **must always** be accompanied by an adult if they enter the vestry area. If you struggle with steps it may be easier to approach the toilet from the outside door – please ask a church warden for help.



Giving of Holy Communion

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you.

Eat and drink (whether physically or spiritually) in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

The president and people receive communion.

If you are baptized (christened) and want to grow closer to God you are welcome to receive Holy Communion here.

Alternatively, you are invited to receive a blessing.

Gluten-free wafers are available.

Please ask the person administering bread.

If you would like communion brought to you in your pew, please let a steward know.




During the administration of communion, hymns may be sung. The hymn numbers are on the board to the left of the eagle lectern.




Refreshments are often served after the mid-morning Sunday service.


All welcome.
