

Farewell to the Rector

After almost 7 years here, Sunday 18th June sees our Rector lead her final Sunday services in St Laurence Church. Following the 9.30am service there will be 'coffee and cakes' in the Pastoral Centre. She will still be working in the parish until the end of June to do her best to leave us equipped for the months ahead.

The preceding evening there will be a 'Church Family Party' from 6 – 8pm with a bring and share supper. We'll be playing some of the games we've enjoyed at Epiphany Parties in the past and there may even be a few games of Beetle. Rumour has it that Canon Janet is STILL using up the beetle grids her father made in 1977!

But what will happen when we don't have a Rector?

For those not familiar with the strange ways of the CofE, it is normal to have a period of at least 9 months and more often 1-2 years between Rectors. This used to be called an "Interregnum" but now the preferred term is "Vacancy." During this time the Church Wardens are legally in charge and have a lot more work to do so if you can help in any way please do. We particularly need more sides-people to help welcome and tidy-up on Sunday mornings, and people to be a server at the Sunday Eucharist which involves helping to set up, clear away and pass the bread and wine etc to the priest during the service.

We have nearly all the Sunday Services up until Christmas covered by priests in the local area – you will have to get used to more male priests again! Wednesday Services are also covered for the next few months too. Also, with a full time Area Dean we will be able to look to the Revd Phelim O'Hare for advice and support.

What about St Laurence Church Schools?

Some members of the congregation have been observing Collective Worship in recent months and will lead this on occasion as will members of other churches. School services will still be held in church led by the Area Dean and the Diocesan clergy and by members of the school team too.

What about Pastoral Care?

Some years ago we introduced “Look Out Groups” and divided the congregation into small groups with leaders to look-out for one another in an informal way. Fr John and Sue Richards have kindly offered to re-launch these groups and keep an eye on them over the summer.

What about Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals?

Fr John has already offered to take baptisms and we have at least one lay person interested in helping with the preparation. For weddings the team at St Chad’s, Rubery will be involved and give them a welcome opportunity to officiate at weddings in a historic church. For funerals our Reader Janice has developed this ministry in recent years. We will also draw on other retired and local clergy – including Revd Theresa especially for such services for those living in St Bart’s Parish until they have a new church.

Church Fabric

Our restoration of St Laurence Church continues with repair work to the ceiling due to commence towards the end of May and lasting about a month. We are hoping that the church will remain open for services through the work which is being undertaken by local company ‘Cambro’ who have done many repairs for us over the years. A few areas of the ceiling will need to be replastered and considerable areas will be boarded (as happened last year in some areas) so as to keep the historic plaster safe.

We also have public notices on display regarding an additional heater (already in place – oops!) and the new liturgical furniture – altar, portable font (we are keeping the old font in place), paschal candle stand and lectern. These are being made by Joe Warbrick who lives in Kings Heath and made the altar for the new church in Dorridge. The furniture is being funded by the Harlow Trust and a generous donation from Barbara Finch, partly in memory of her parents. We hope the furniture will be with us later this year.

New Website for St Laurence Church

Peter Mitchell (who put together all those montages in lock-down) has been developing a new web-site for St Laurence Church in recent months and it should be replacing the current one very soon. He has also kindly agreed to keep it up to date as much as he can.

Do remember to look at the web-site to check on details of events – for instance this news-letter will be on it.

Revd Claire Whitmore

Remember Claire who was an Ordinand with us during lockdown and managed 'Zoom Control' until we got the hang of it? She also led a very moving reflection on Good Friday 2021 and from her experience of living in a very diverse part of London helped us think through a few issues relating to racial justice.

Claire will be ordained priest on Saturday 1st July at All Saints, Kingston-upon-Thames and will celebrate Holy Communion for the first time on Sunday 2nd July at the church where she is serving her curacy which is Holy Trinity, Roehampton. Canon Janet and Peter are delighted that they will be able to attend both services and Janet has been invited to be one of the priests to lay hands on Claire, along with the Bishop.

Churches Together in Northfield

Canon Janet has chaired CTiN for the last five years though, as she herself admits, over the last two years it has been very much keeping it ticking over as there has been a dearth of ministers in the local churches which has added to the load on the lay people. Revd Theresa was appointed as the new chairperson at the recent AGM but again recognising that it needs a real team effort to get events and activities off the ground or for one church to take a strong lead.

At the meeting we discussed whether some churches could be "Friends of CTiN", especially those whose constitution does not permit them to join an official group and this looks to have potential. The good news is that there are a lot of Christians in Northfield who want to work together and pray together. Some attend "Church Central South" which meets in King Edward VI High School for Girls and over the last year have organised an Alternative Halloween Event in the Shopping Centre, the Good Friday Walk of Witness as well as regular Prayer meetings/walks. Some of the more traditional churches, including ourselves, have been delighted to join in with there initiatives.

God is very much at work in our community. Praise Be!

The **Revd Canon Eve Pitts** has recently been awarded a lifetime Achievement award at the 2023 Pride of Birmingham Awards. Eve has devoted her life to helping others and to fighting racism. The CofE Birmingham has been blessed consistently and generously by her long term ministry, all of which has been served in Birmingham, latterly as Vicar of the Parish Church of Holy Trinity, Birchfield, and prior to that serving in the parishes of Bartley Green, Kings Norton, and Highters Heath. It is with great joy I congratulate Eve on her lifetime achievement award and look forward to following her progress as she visits every former slave port in Britain to pay respects to the dead and enrich her campaign for the recognition of 1st August as “Ancestors’ Day” to commemorate the coming into force of the Slavery Abolition Act in 1833.



The **Revd Canon Smitha Prasadam**, currently Chaplain of St Albans, Copenhagen, has been announced the next Suffragan Bishop of Huddersfield. Smitha trained at Queens, served her curacy in Blackheath, and was latterly Vicar of St Pauls, Hamstead.
